ABOUT THE HOMETOWN PROJECT:

The Hometown Project activates well-known artists to support local candidates and causes in their hometowns. Now entering its 8th election cycle, Hometown has recruited and mobilized over 95 influential "Hometown Energizers" (such as Kerry Washington, Selena Gomez, Edward Norton, Patton Oswalt, Wanda Sykes, Mark Ruffalo, Connie Britton, Aimee Mann, Jon Hamm, Molly Shannon and Yvette Nicole Brown) who in turn have supported over 150 local candidates in their hometowns, and/or promoted the importance of local elections. We seek to elevate the message of local campaigns and motivate voter turnout in local elections where a few hundred votes can make a big difference. The Hometown Project is currently seeking interns to help build and support our 2024 initiatives in key states across the country.

POSITION SUMMARY:

Interns report to the Director of Program & Operations and are responsible for duties ranging from helping build and enhance our database of musicians, actors and athletes, to building out candidate information for various internal and external materials. While learning and utilizing online platforms and programs like Squarespace, Canva, Airtable and others, interns will actively contribute to program planning, social media content, campaigns and monitoring of digital campaigns, graphic design and digital marketing pieces, and community outreach. This is a unique start-up that is well connected in the entertainment and political community. This is a "hands-on" learning opportunity working with a small team, yet is done remotely with some independence and flexibility of schedule.
